The Ideal 4 year schedule

- The general principle is you can mix and trade within a column
- IF needed, you may mix and trade in the first two columns but minimize doing do
- The key is to finish the first two columns prior to starting column 3

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 (Each column is one year)
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Typical Schedule

- You MUST start a language sequence immediately
- I list Hebrew but you may take Greek first if you wish.
- I put Hebrew first as you take Old Testament Classes the 2nd Year where it will be useful.

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Typical Schedule

- Be sure to follow the policies listed in the footnotes for the NOND class as well as planning your science requirements
- Read the fine print!

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Typical Schedule

If you take a Summer Religion class, move "Introduction to Ministry up to the Fall Semester if you can.

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TRANSFER STUDENTS AND CHANGE OF MAJORS

The Ideal 4 year schedule

- Still try to finish as much of the first two columns as possible prior to looking to column 3-4 for classes.
- Save Christian Theology for your last year

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Typical Schedule

- If you have not had any biblical language class, you **MUST** start a language sequence immediately
- This affects your ability to enter the preaching sequence
- You must get two semesters of language with Exegesis (in Winter) to enter the Preaching sequence the following fall.

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Typical Schedule

▣ Advantages of Hebrew first

- ▣ May dovetail with taking Old Testament I and II
- ▣ Easier Grammar than Greek

▣ Disadvantages

- ▣ More vocabulary
- ▣ Many tricky words due to letters dropping, morphing, etc.
- ▣ More exceptions to keep track of

▣ Advantages of Greek first

- ▣ Alphabet easier to learn
- ▣ Vocabulary is smaller and has many cognates to English
- ▣ Very logical system of endings
- ▣ May coincide with taking New Testament classes

▣ Many, many paradigms (endings) to learn

Typical Schedule

- ▣ If you already have 3 credits of Religion, take Introduction to Ministry IMMEDIATELY.
 - Else, take some religion classes your first semester and Intro. to Ministry in your second semester.

Typical Schedule

- Be sure to follow the policies listed in the footnotes for planning your science requirements
- You will not need the NOND class as a transfer student
- Read the fine print!
